These two presentations address topics of general safety in fertiliser plants and more widely. Both authors will speak from practical experience of these and other safety issues, and the papers will be of value to a wide audience.

11:30 "Food, fertilisers and footprints - an environmental essay", Francis New Memorial Lecture, *Chris Dawson, York, UK.*

This 25th Francis New Memorial Lecture will be delivered by the Medallist, Chris Dawson, current Secretary and past President of the Society. He will take an overview of the issues surrounding the production of sufficient food for the population in the context of the current debates on environmental protection, including particular examination of the essentiality of fertilisers.

13:30 "Relationships between nutrient recycling, environmental impacts and agricultural production",

Jaap Schröder, Plant Research International, Wageningen, The Netherlands.

The author will discuss agricultural production in relation to energy use and environmental issues, focussing on concerns about nutrient losses from the system and the considerable potential that exists for their recycling. He will draw particular attention to the complex interactions that inevitably exist at all stages of agricultural activity, the difficulties that arise when a solution to any one stage is considered in isolation, and the need for an integrated approach.

14:30 "Fertiliser supply and demand: outlook for costs and availabilities".

Bernard Brentnall, Fertilizer & Chemical Consultancy Ltd, Kent, UK.

The recent significant changes in the availability and price of many fertiliser materials make a reassessment of the medium term supply and demand outlook a very appropriate topic for this Meeting. The author has wide experience in this area and anticipates a lively discussion following his presentation.

Benefits of the Meeting.

This general Meeting of the Society is open to all, including non-members, and will start with two presentations relating to site safety. These will be followed by two papers which discuss agriculture and fertiliser use as the basis of food production but also as providers of non-food biological outputs and having significant potential to influence the global environment. Finally the Meeting will hear a very topical presentation on the outlook for fertiliser supply and demand in the light of recent movements in fertiliser prices.

Time is provided for the authors to address their subject in some depth, and also for delegates and speakers to discuss the issues and technicalities raised. Meetings of the Society are attended by Members and others from a wide range of disciplines and from many countries, and present an excellent opportunity to make new contacts and to renew old acquaintances. A set of printed Proceedings is available for the Meeting, together with a delegate list.
